Addressing the Need for High Quality Curriculum

State-Based Curriculum Review Training

What is it?

The Standards-in-Action (SIA) 2.0 project, under the leadership of Susan Pimentel, is once again preparing to offer its State-Based Curriculum Review training series. Originally piloted in 2019 with 10 state teams, the training has been refined and is now available to other interested states. If you would like to learn how to ensure the content of your teaching aligns to the content of your standards, then this training is for you! It's being offered in two subject areas: English Language Arts (ELA)/Literacy and Mathematics. States can register a team for one or both trainings. The trainings begin in March 2022.¹

Both training protocols are designed to assess the degree to which curricula align to your state standards. Both will also assess the degree to which curricula include supports for English learners (ELs) to access a curriculum's core academic content. They offer a hybrid approach to training that includes:

- A series of six 2-hour interactive online trainings presented by national standards experts in each subject;
- Offline assignments that allow state teams to apply specific lessons from each online training to conduct state-based curriculum review; and
- Follow-up remote assistance from an SIA 2.0 coach with specialized subject matter expertise to guide and support the state team's at-home work.

Sessions will occur every two weeks using Zoom video conferencing. State teams will meet (in person or virtually) during the in-between weeks for their offline assignments.

Why is quality curriculum so important?

All curricula share one goal: to help students learn. A good curriculum makes teaching and learning consistent within and across levels of learning. Curriculum is the *indispensable* link between standards and assessments. With curriculum resources, instructors organize content and set learning tasks, so a curriculum can—and should—ensure alignment to critical aspects of your academic standards.

An *overall goal* of this training is to spur the review of existing curricula in your state, so all instructors have the tools they need to improve student outcomes.

What are the training dates?

Multi-state virtual training sessions will begin in March 2022, with ELA/Literacy and Mathematics meeting on alternate weeks. There is time between sessions for state team members to meet to apply what they learned. Your team will also attend an orientation session presented (and scheduled) by your SIA 2.0 coach, prior to the start of the multi-state sessions.

What are the benefits of participating?

1. Understand when existing curricula should be replaced, modified, or supplemented. That includes recognizing the necessary traits of strong standards-aligned curricula,
2. Build instructors' capacity to align their teaching with your standards' demands, including instructional supports for ELs to access core academic content.
3. Acquire the knowledge and skills required to conduct curriculum reviews and train others on the process.
4. Access training and technical assistance to create an action plan to meet *all* your state's current and long-range curriculum needs.

What are participating states expected to do?

1. Identify a state liaison for the SIA 2.0 project. (This person will also lead your state's continuing curriculum review efforts.)
2. Form a team (or teams) with a minimum of five members.
3. Commit to supporting your team members' participation in the project through the training and beyond.
4. Select a curriculum currently in use in the relevant content area(s) to review during the course of the training.
5. Develop an action plan to expand your state's curriculum reviews after the training.

What is the state lead expected to do?

1. Send reminders to team members about upcoming Zoom sessions.
2. Send homework assignments to the team.
3. Schedule in-between work sessions to evaluate the selected curriculum.
4. Schedule additional in-between work sessions to review the team's findings with the SIA 2.0 coach.
5. Serve as the liaison between your team and the SIA 2.0 team.
6. Lead the development of a curriculum review action plan.

What are team members expected to do?

1. Attend all training sessions in your selected subject(s).
2. Apply lessons from each multi-state training session to the review of your selected curriculum during the in-between work sessions.
3. Work with an SIA 2.0 coach via every-other-week Zoom check-ins to debrief the review of your selected curriculum.
4. Assist with developing an action plan to expand your state's curriculum review alignment efforts after the training.
